Assignments, exercises, presentation

- You will create a **student home page**, a web page to showcase all your work for the **assignments** in this course
- There are 6 assignments, As01, As02, ..., As06
- **Exercises** are optional, but highly recommended
- Assignments are all web pages or web applications
- Assignments are ungraded until you deliver your **final presentation**, that is, you will not receive a specific grade for each assignment but instead you will get an overall grade for your final presentation
- Add each assignments to your **student home page**. At the end of the course, you will present what you have done in a **final presentation**.

Quizzes

- 10 minutes (each), sometimes more
- 10 questions (one minute per question)
- One question at a time
- Quiz opens at precise time and closes at precise time
- All online - instant grading!

Coding Test

- 60 minutes
- Starts exactly at beginning of class
- You will code your work, and submit code in Canvas as text
- I will grade it that week and post grade by next class session
- Programming well means programming correctly, and *quickly*
- Coding test is a series of small but progressively more challenging JavaScript programs that manipulate HTML and CSS

Time requirements

4 credits = 4 hrs class + 8 hrs homework
= 12 hrs/wk Fall (or 24 hrs/wk, Spring)

CH-A3: The credit-hour definition does not dictate particular amounts of classroom time versus out-of-class student work. Further note that the definition provides that a credit hour may be for an equivalent amount of work over a different amount of time. There is no requirement that a 3-semester hour course meet 3 hours per week during a semester or a 3-quarter-hour course meet 3 hours per week during a quarter. The requirement is that the institution determine that there is an amount of student work for a credit hour that reasonably approximates not less than one hour of class and two hours of out-of-class student work per week over a semester for a semester hour or a quarter for a quarter hour. For example, an institution with a semester-based calendar has a graduate seminar for which it awards 3 semester hours. The class meets only one hour per week over a 15-week semester with the students expected to perform a substantial amount of outside research that is the equivalent of 8 or more hours of student work each week of the semester.

Fall Semester - In Person

- 5 hrs/wk - Class session

Fall Semester - Hybrid
